

Introduction

You want the best for your children. All parents do. You want to support your children as they move through high school and make their first career decisions in their move towards adulthood. It is important that you are up to date with the career journey space and you use quality, timely and accurate information. A lot has changed since you left



school and we do young people no service if we provide them with out of date, biassed and/or incorrect information.

In general, the most up-to-date career information can be found on the Internet. This handout will walk you through the current 'career space'.

First things first - Understand that:

- Ongoing learning will be a feature of their working lives as new occupations emerge and current occupations change or become obsolete.

Make opportunities to:

- Have ongoing discussions with your child about their ideas of what they might like to do when they leave school.
- Help them to think of the decision/s they make at the end of school as their 'first step' forward.
- Listen to your child's career dreams even if you think they are unrealistic. Career exploration often starts with a dream.
- Talk with your child about your job (take them to work with you) and your career decision-making experiences.
- Help your child gain awareness of their strengths, interests, values (what's important to them). There are many online quizzes that can help them identify their qualities.
- Talk about things that might positively or negatively influence their career decisions (e.g. your opinion, friends' opinions, length of training or study, income, employment opportunities, the media, etc.). It's important that they understand these influences and manage them positively.

While still at school

Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority: The Queensland Curriculum and Assessment Authority (QCAA) is responsible for the development and appropriate delivery of kindergarten through to secondary education in Queensland. Find out about assessments, exams and subject syllabuses.

<u>Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC)</u>: QTAC provides a one-stop shop for 17 higher education providers in Queensland and northern New South Wales. They calculate students' ATAR and give out offers to students seeking to enter university or TAFE (at diploma level and above).
